SAFE ARRIVAL – REPORTING STUDENT ABSENCES

Whether it's an illness, a medical appointment or other important event, there are times when students may need to be away from school. The District School Board of Niagara uses the SAFE ARRIVAL program for parents to report their child(ren)'s absences. Using the Safe Arrival system, parents will be able to report daily absences, and even schedule absences in one of three ways:

1. Call toll-free before bell time: 1-866-606-5567
2. Logging on to the web portal (<https://go.schoolmessenger.ca/#/account/login>). Using this website, you can set up your account to report and schedule absences.
3. Using your smart phone or tablet. Simply download the SchoolMessenger app. The app is compatible with both Apple and Android devices.

Please report all absences prior to bell time for the current day. If your child has an upcoming appointment, you can also schedule future absences by using one of these three methods. TRANSPORTATION

If you need to request transportation for your child, or make a change to their schedule, please contact the school office. We ask for your patience as we endeavour to ensure that our students arrive to school on time and return home as close to the arrival time that you have been given. Students only on a bus route can take the bus.



YARD SUPERVISION

Supervision before school, begins at 8:50 a.m. Parents/Guardians are asked NOT to drop off their children prior to 8:50 a.m. as there is no supervision on the playground until that time. Parents will be contacted by the office if children are left at the school prior to the supervised time. End of the day dismissal is at 3:25 p.m. and parents are asked to be prompt in picking up their children. Students are expected to go home after school.



SCHOOL INFORMATION

Entry and Exit Routines



Students will be shown which doors they are expected to enter and exit each day. This will become routine for students quickly in September.

If you are picking up your child(ren) from school, we ask that you **wait outside** or arrange with your child(ren) where you would like them. If older students are picking up younger siblings, they too are expected to follow these procedures. This is *for the safety of your children*. Also, for safety reasons, doors will be locked after our morning bell and entry shall be through the main doors on the buzzer system. All visitors must sign in at the office.

We appreciate your co-operation in this matter.

If you are driving to pick up your son/daughter, please adhere to the parking signs and bus lane signs. Please be aware of bus loading zones and wait patiently for our students to disembark and/or load our buses.



Anaphylaxis

We have children with severe allergies to **peanuts, nuts, nut products and shellfish. Just touching or smelling one of these allergens can cause a life-threatening anaphylactic reaction for students at our school.** Prevention is the best approach! We ask your cooperation in using discretion when sending food to school. We also request that you speak to your child about these allergies and about the importance of washing their hands with soap and warm water.

We know that if we work together, we can help to create a safe learning environment for all of our students. We thank you for your understanding and co-operation.

Students with Medical Needs

If your child has any special medical concerns or requires medication that is to be administered during school hours, please contact the office so we can discuss your child's medical needs and share the forms with you. The forms must be completed, and medication must be sent to school in the original container with the label attached. Please contact the office for additional information.

Cash Online

As you know Fitch Street School uses School Cash Online and we are looking forward to having all of our families register for School Cash. Families must register in order to receive notifications of upcoming events, lunches & school activities and to **sign class permission forms**. We **STRONGLY ENCOURAGE** families to complete the registration process for School Cash Online.
